

**CLOSE OF REGISTRATION NOTICE
FOR THE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2022
ST. CLAIR COUNTY, MICHIGAN**

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY, MICHIGAN: Unregistered, but eligible voters, who wish to participate in the November 8, 2022 election may register at their local clerk's office, the office of the County Clerk, a Secretary of State Branch office, by mail or online by Monday, October 24, 2022 at www.Michigan.gov/VoterRegistration. Voters who are already registered may update their registration at www.expressSOS.com.

The last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk is Monday, October 24, 2022.

After this date, anyone who qualifies as an elector may register to vote in-person with proof of residency (MCL 168.497) at their City/Township Clerk's office.

The following is a listing of the races and a brief description of the proposals that will appear on the ballot:

PARTISAN: Governor and Lieutenant Governor; Secretary of State; Attorney General; Representative in Congress (9th District); State Senators (12th or 25th District); Representatives in State Legislature (63rd, 64th, or 65th District); Member of the State Board of Education; Regent of the University of Michigan; Trustee of Michigan State University; Governor of Wayne State University; and St Clair County Commissioners (Districts 1-7); Yale City-Mayor, Clerk, Treasurer, and Council; Casco Twp Supervisor and Trustee; China Twp Clerk and Treasurer; Cottrellville Twp Trustee; East China Twp Supervisor, Clerk, and Park Commissioners; Fort Gratiot Twp Park Commissioners; Ira Twp Trustee; Kenockee Twp Clerk; Port Huron Twp Park Commissioner; Riley Twp Clerk; and Wales Twp Trustee.

NONPARTISAN: Justice of Supreme Court; Judge of Court of Appeals; Judge of Circuit Court; Judge of District Court; Algonac City Council; Marine City Mayor and Commissioners; Marysville Mayor and Council; Port Huron City Mayor and Council; St Clair City Mayor and Council; Village of Capac President and Council; Village of Emmett President, Clerk, Treasurer, and Council. The following school district board members: Algonac Community Schools, Almont Community Schools, Anchor Bay School District, Armada Area Schools, Brown City Community Schools, Capac Community Schools, Croswell-Lexington Community Schools, East China Schools, Marysville Public Schools, Memphis Community Schools, Port Huron Area School District, Richmond Community Schools, Yale Public Schools, and St Clair County Community College.

Below is a brief description of the ballot proposals that will appear on the ballot:

State Proposal 22-1: A proposal to amend the state constitution to require annual public financial disclosure reports by legislators and other state officers and change state legislator term limit to 12 total years in legislature

State Proposal 22-2: A proposal to amend the state constitution to add provisions regarding elections

State Proposal 22-3: A proposal to amend the state constitution to establish new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make all decisions about pregnancy and abortion; allow state to regulate abortion in some cases; and forbid prosecution of individuals exercising established right

Clay Township: New Millage for Road and Ditch Improvement and Maintenance (0.35 mills for each \$1,000 of taxable value for (5) five years)

Marysville City: Proposed Amendment to Section 14.1 of the City of Marysville Charter (Purchase and Sale of Property)

Memphis City: Initiative Referendum to Repeal City of Memphis Ordinances Section 117.01-117.10 Regulating Marihuana Establishments and Initiative Petition to Prohibit Adult Use Marihuana Establishments within the City of Memphis

Anchor Bay Schools: Bonding Proposal

Armada Schools: Bonding Proposal, Operating Millage Renewal Proposal, and Sinking Fund Millage Proposal (0.85 mills for each \$1,000 of taxable value for (10) ten years)

Brown City Community Schools: Sinking Fund Millage Proposal (1.5 mills for each \$1,000 of taxable value for (10) ten years)

Macomb Intermediate School District: Special Education Facilities Improvement Bond Proposal
