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**ST. CLAIR COUNTY**

**Proposition 20-1**

**Renewal of Road Improvement Millage**

For the purpose of raising funds to be used to improve and maintain roads, streets and highways within St. Clair County and for use as matching funds necessary to obtain State and Federal highway improvement aid for use in St. Clair County, shall the one-quarter (0.25) mill (\$.25 per thousand dollars of state taxable valuation) levy upon the total amount of taxes which may be assessed in one (1) year upon all property within the County of St. Clair, Michigan, be renewed for four (4) years, 2020 through 2023, inclusive? Based on the State of Michigan taxable values of real property, this millage would raise an estimated \$1,561,412.00 in the first year the levy is renewed.

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**ST. CLAIR COUNTY**

**Proposition 20-2**

**Renewal of Drug Investigation and Prosecution Task Force Millage**

Shall a previously voter approved St. Clair County millage of .5610 mills (\$.5610 per \$1,000 of taxable value) in excess of constitutional limitations be renewed for a period of 4 years, from 2020 through 2023 inclusive, to be used for the purpose of providing funds for the operation of a Drug Task Force, comprised of personnel and equipment from the St. Clair County Sheriff's Office and the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney of St. Clair County, to investigate and prosecute individuals involved in the distribution of illegal controlled substances and related offenses? This proposed millage is a renewal of a previously approved millage in the same amount. If approved and levied in full this millage would raise estimated revenues of \$3,497,399 the first year levied.

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**CLYDE TOWNSHIP**

**Proposal 1**

**Renewal of Millage for the Clyde Township Fire Department General Operating Expenses**

Shall Clyde Township be authorized to levy a millage of .25 mills (\$.25 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) constituting a renewal of a previously authorized voter approved millage against all property subject to ad valorem taxation for each year for four (4) consecutive years, commencing, in 2021 and continuing through 2025, inclusive, for the purpose of providing revenue for general operating expenses for the Clyde Township Fire Department. If approved, the estimated revenue generated in the first year this renewal millage is levied would be approximately \$42,034.00.

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**CLYDE TOWNSHIP**

**Proposal 2**

**Proposal for Millage Increase for the Clyde Township Fire Department**

Shall the limitation of the total of taxes which may be assessed against all real and taxable personal property in the Township of Clyde, County of St. Clair, State of Michigan, be increased by three-quarter of a mill (\$.75 per \$1,000.00 of state taxable value) as finally equalized for a period of four (4) years, commencing with 2021 and continuing through 2024, inclusive, for the exclusive purposes of maintaining, operating and/or improving fire protection in Clyde Township, including, but not limited to, maintaining and/or expanding existing fire protection levels, payment of fees charged to the Township for fire coverage provided to the Township by other departments, creating a capital improvement fund for fire protection, and/or reduce or eliminate fees charged for service calls. The estimated revenue generated in the first year for Fire Protection in Clyde Township would be \$126,103.00.

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**GRANT TOWNSHIP**

**Millage Renewal  
Fire Protection Services**

Shall the previous voted increase in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution in Grant Township of 1 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value), reduced to 0.9868 mill (\$0.9868 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at and increased up to the original voted 1 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for ten (10) years, 2021 through 2030 inclusive, for fire protection services, raising an estimated \$67,700.00 in 2021?

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**PORT HURON TOWNSHIP**

**Proposal 1**

**Public Bus Transportation Service Millage Renewal Proposition**

Shall the Charter Township of Port Huron renew a previously authorized millage not to exceed 0.875 mills (\$0.88 per \$1,000 of state taxable value), on all real and personal property not exempt by law within the Township for a period of four (4) years, commencing in 2020 to the year 2023, inclusive, for the purpose of providing busing service within the Township? If approved and levied, an estimated \$220,051.00 would be raised in 2020, of which a portion will be disbursed to the Port Huron Township Downtown Development Authority as required by law.

Shall the proposition be approved?

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**PORT HURON TOWNSHIP**

**Proposal 2**

**Local Road Improvement Millage Renewal Proposition**

Shall the Charter Township of Port Huron renew a previously authorized millage in an amount not to exceed one (1) mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of state taxable value), on all real and personal property in the Township not exempt by law, for a period of four (4) years, beginning in 2020 and through the year 2023, for the purposes of constructing, improving, and maintaining local roads in the Township? If approved and levied an estimated \$251,487.00 would be raised in 2020, of which a portion will be disbursed to the Port Huron Township Downtown Development Authority as required by law.

Shall this proposition be approved?

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**YALE CITY**

**Proposal 1**

**Proposal for Renewal of Millage for Street Improvements**

Shall the limitation of the total amount of taxes which may be imposed against all real and personal taxable property in the City of Yale, County of St. Clair, State of Michigan, be increased by 1.5 mills (\$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of State Taxable Value) of the taxable value of all taxable property in the City, as finally equalized, for each year for five (5) years, commencing with 2021 and continuing through 2025, inclusive, for the specific purpose of providing funds to maintain, improve, repair, replace, and/or construct streets and sidewalks, including drainage therefrom, in the City of Yale? The estimated revenue to the City of Yale during the first year of this proposed millage, if approved, is \$48,733. If approved, this millage would be a renewal of a previously authorized millage.

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**YALE CITY**

**Proposal 2**

**Proposal for Renewal of Millage for Sidewalk Improvements**

Shall the limitation of the total amount of taxes which may be imposed against all real and personal taxable property in the City of Yale, County of St. Clair, State of Michigan, be increased by 0.25 mills (\$.25 per \$1,000.00 of State Taxable Value) of the taxable value of all taxable property in the City, as finally equalized, for each year for five (5) years, commencing with 2021 and continuing through 2025, inclusive, for the specific purpose of providing funds to maintain, improve, repair, replace, and/or construct sidewalks in the City of Yale? The estimated revenue increase to the City of Yale during the first year of this proposed millage, if approved, is \$8,122. If approved, this millage would be a renewal of a previously authorized millage.

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**CAPAC COMMUNITY SCHOOLS**

**Operating Millage Proposal**

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation allowance and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Capac Community Schools, St. Clair and Lapeer Counties, Michigan, be renewed by 17.7008 mills (\$17.7008 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2021 to 2030, inclusive, and also be increased by .5 mill (\$0.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2021 to 2030, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2021 is approximately \$844,500 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2020 levy and a restoration of millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?
